Conditions of Grant Awards and Links to Resources

Purpose

This document describes conditions of award for Adult Education and Literacy (AEL) subrecipients and provides links to resources to pertinent Federal and State statute and guidance. This document's resources will be updated as needed.

Conditions of Award

All AEL grants require compliance with all applicable state and federal rules, regulation, and policies, including but not limited to:

- Funding must be used to establish or operate programs that provide adult education and literacy activities and provide such activities concurrently.
- Activities supported with Federal and State AEL funds are necessary, reasonable and allowable.
- Adult Diploma Program funds support allowable activities per state statute and policy.
- Subrecipient will provide the full range of services as described in published AEL policies.
- Per AEL policy, grantee will not deny services to eligible students without prior consultation with the Vermont Agency of Education.
- AEL learners will <u>not</u> be charged for services and materials, with the following exception:
 - Examinees may be charged the fee set by GED Testing Service for each computer-based GED examination.
 - GED fees collected may <u>not</u> be considered program income.
 - Federal AEL funds may <u>not</u> be used to pay for GED examinee fees.
- Subrecipient agrees to operate as a unified, statewide AEL system and that all work under this funding will be in full compliance with the AEL vision, mission and common practice, policies, and procedures defined by State and Federal legislation governing AEL.
- Subrecipient agrees to fully cooperate with evaluation and monitoring processes conducted by the AOE, which includes audit of services and access to all records, books, papers, or documents related to performance of AEL work under the grants.
- Grantee will maintain learner service records, AEL procedural manuals, AEL curricula, and AEL fiscal accounting records on expenditure of award monies.

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- Grantee will participate in regional teams/activities convened in response to the WIOA Combined State Plan, which may be related to: collaborating with one-stop centers at DOL, cross-training, business outreach, and data sharing.
- The grantee will ensure that data entry is timely in accordance with AEL policy: instruction hours and other pertinent data must be entered at least every two weeks. File maintenance must be done quarterly.
- All data entry and changes must be linked to and documented in the student's Personalized Learning Plan (PLP).
- The grantee will ensure that staff (manager or other assigned staff) at each center will run reports and monitor progress toward established targets and ensure that Educational Functioning Levels (EFLs) have not expired.
- Grantee will ensure that all staff are trained on relevant manuals and policies and that this training is a standard part of new staff orientation.
- Grantee will meet established performance targets as described in the grant agreements or the grant amount may be reduced.
- Grantee will post policies publicly, including grantee's website.
- Provider matches an amount equal to 25% of the total federal funds expended on the allowable activities under the grant (cash and/or in-kind).
- The full and actual dollar amount of matching resources, including in-kind, committed for the initial grant award period are maintained through subsequent years of the grant duration (Maintenance of Effort).
- Integrated Education and Training (IET) programs provide participants with workforce training in one or more in-demand industries as identified in the Combined State Plan.
- All programs supported with grant funds must meet applicable Federal AEFLA requirements (i.e., IET).
- Teachers, assessors, plan managers, and program administrators will have an Individual Professional Development Plan (IPDP) that is updated/revised at least annually, per the AEL Policy Statements.
- Grantee will sign all required federal and state assurances prior to release of funding.
- Grantee will take necessary steps to ensure compliance with Federal and State nondiscrimination laws of grantee materials and websites.
- Per the General Education Provisions Act (GEPA), Section 427 program ensures equitable access to, and equitable participation in the program for learners, teachers, and other program beneficiaries with special needs.

By signing AEL grant agreements, subrecipient certifies that all applicable state and federal rules, regulations and policies will be observed and that, to the best of his/her knowledge, the information contained in all financial and other programmatic proposals and reports are correct and complete.
