Issued by the Vermont Agency of Education pursuant to State Board of Education Rule Series 2200

Section 2232 Rate Approval for Therapeutic Approved Independent Schools.

(a) The Secretary shall set, after consultation with independent schools, the maximum tuition rate to be paid by the Agency and supervisory unions or school districts to therapeutic independent schools. The rate for each therapeutic independent school shall be no more than the costs that are reasonably related to the level of services provided by the school.

(b) If a therapeutic independent school does not submit an application for rate approval by November 15, the most recently approved rate will be in effect for the following school year...

This letter is to officially notify Baird School that the following CERT and tuition rates have been approved concurrently by the Department of Mental Health and the Agency of Education for the 2023 – 2024 school year for Baird School. Official education tuition rates were approved by the Agency of Education's Rate Setting Committee, as per Vermont State Board Rule 2232.

As therapeutic schools, CERT programs have treatment and education rates. If a student is Medicaid enrolled, the treatment is paid through Medicaid which is a combination of federal and state/local match. The match is paid by the LEA. For non-Medicaid enrolled students, the treatment portion is fully paid by the LEA.
