Finding Detail: There were significant and systemic errors with the breakfast and lunch meal counts at St. Albans City Elementary School and SOAR Learning Center resulting in overclaims.

Finding Detail: The production records for SOAR Learning Center do not indicate that students were offered milk choice or sufficient quantities of fruit and vegetable. Additional information is needed for the pre-k meals at St. Albans City Elementary School.

Finding Detail: SOAR Learning Center did not have reimbursable meal signage posted and the order sheet included fruit and milk in the same category.
