SUBJECT: ARP-ESSER Afterschool State Set-Aside Grant Application

DATE: July 6, 2022

### **Purpose**

By this memo you are notified that the application for the ARP-ESSER Afterschool State Set-Aside Grant Application for Vermont LEAs is now available in the <u>Grant Management System</u> (GMS). ARP-ESSER funds are available as part of the <u>ARP Act of 2021</u>. The applications for this competitive grant opportunity are due August 15, 2022.

#### **Overview**

Created by ARP ESSER Section 2001(f)(3), this funding is set aside for the creation and support of high-quality, evidence-based afterschool and summer programs across Vermont. This program is particularly focused on addressing the ongoing impacts of COVID-19 on students' academic, social and emotional needs as well as addressing the disproportionate impact of the pandemic on marginalized groups.

Within Vermont, this fund is being administered as a competitive grant program in line with Vermont's Education Recovery and Revitalization framework. LEAs statewide are invited to submit applications detailing how this funding could support their local COVID-19 recovery strategies and the overall goal of providing equal access to high quality education to every Vermont learner. Awards under this program will be available on one of two tracks depending on the scope of the applicant's project.

- Track A is for program development, expanded learning opportunities, after school expansion and/or capacity building activity to support existing comprehensive evidence-based afterschool centers(s). Annual awards may range from \$15,000-\$60,000.
- Track B is to develop a comprehensive evidence-based afterschool center. Annual awards amounts are \$50,000-\$135,000.

Regardless of the track selected, grants will be awarded for a two-year period, ending on September 30, 2024.

## **Creating and Editing the Application in the Grant Management System**

All superintendents and business managers have permissions in the GMS to create and edit the application. If desired, a superintendent can delegate the ability to create and edit the application to additional staff by assigning the role "leaESSER" to any staff members with a GMS account. Note that, as with all other grant applications, only the superintendent can agree to assurances and do the final submission to the Agency of Education.
