Froggy of Denali

Before Viewing

- What do you predict the story will be about?
- Have you ever seen a frog outside? Where?

During Viewing

- Is the story matching your predictions, so far?
- What do Molly and Tooey notice about the frog?
- What name did they give the frog? Why?
- Why are they bringing the frog inside?
- What kind of frog did they find?
- What is a predator? How did Molly and Tooey learn about the frog' predators?

After Viewing

- What interesting facts did Molly and Tooey learn about the frog? What resources did they use to help them learn?
- Why could Molly not keep the frog in her house?

After Viewing

- How did the tide guide help the family in this episode?
- What did Molly and Tooey learn about petroglyphs and sea cucumbers in this episode?
