

School Nutrition Programs Administrative Review Summary

Review Findings

A. Meal Access and Reimbursement

1. Certification and Benefit Issuance – Validation of the SFA certification of students' eligibility for free or reduced-price meals.

Finding Detail: The SFA currently operates the Community Eligibility Provision and sent the Free and Reduced-Price School Meal Application to all households of enrolled preschool children instead of the Household Income Form.

2. Verification – Validation of the process used by the SFA to confirm selected students' eligibility for free and reduced-price meals.

3. Meal Counting and Claiming – Validation of the SFA meal counting and claiming system that accurately counts, records, consolidates, and reports the number of reimbursable meals claimed by category.

Finding Detail: (1) Meals were not counted at the Point of Service (POS) at breakfast and lunch on the day of review, and (2) the October 2023 claim for reimbursement was incorrectly consolidated for breakfast, lunch, and snack during the review period.

B. Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality

 Meal Components and Quantities – Validation that meals claimed for reimbursement contain the required meal components / food components and quantities.

Finding Detail: (1) The SFA is not differentiating between meal patterns for the non-co-mingled preschool students that are required to follow the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) meal pattern and the school-age K-12 students that are required to follow the School Meals Program meal pattern, (2) production records were not maintained as required, (3) fluid milk was not offered in at least two varieties for the K-12 age/grade group, (4) the school offered an unallowable milk type on the day of review, (5) meals offered at lunch did not contain all required components during the review period, (6) meals offered at lunch did not contain sufficient quantities during the review period or on the day of review, (7) crediting documentation was not maintained during the review period as required, and (8) grains offered during the review period did not meet the wholegrain rich requirements for the K-12 age/grade group.



2. Offer versus Serve (OVS) – Validation of SFA compliance with provision that allows students to decline some of the food components offered.

Finding Detail: Staff are not adequately trained on Offer versus Serve (OVS) requirements.

 Dietary Specifications and Nutrient Analysis – Validation that meals offered to children through the school meal programs are consistent with federal standards.

C. Resource Management

 Resource Management – Validation that SFA ensures the overall financial health of the school food service including non-profit food service account, paid lunch equity, revenue from non-program foods, and indirect costs.

Finding Detail: The SFA flagged for a review of Revenue from Non-Program Foods and Indirect Costs. (1) The SFA currently provides meals to non-program adults and does not obtain payment and/or recover the cost of those meals by other sources, (2) The SFA is not tracking costs and revenues for nonprogram foods including adult meals served, (3) the SFA does not clearly label or separate non-program foods from program foods in the dry storage and cold storage areas, and (4) The SFA is not appropriately applying the indirect cost rate to the nonprofit school food service account.

D. General Program Compliance

1. Civil Rights – Validation of SFA compliance with civil rights requirements as applicable to the Child Nutrition Programs.

Finding Detail: The letter to households informing families about the availability of free meals for the preschool did not include the non-discrimination statement.

Finding Detail: (1) The Local School Wellness Policy is outdated and does not meet minimum requirements, (2) the SFA did not complete the Triennial



assessment, and (3) potential stakeholders were not made aware of their ability to participate in the development, review, update, and implementation of the local school wellness policy.

4. Smart Snacks in School – Validation of the SFA compliance with regulations for all food and beverages to students outside of the reimbursable meal.

Finding Detail: Professional Standards training hours for all program and non-program staff that have duties related to the Program have not been tracked.

Finding Detail: Internal thermometers were not maintained in the milk cooler on the day of review.

Finding Detail: (1) The SFA did not have documentation on file to show that the School Breakfast Program is being promoted, and (2) The SFA did not have documentation on file to show that the Summer Food Service Program is being promoted.

1. The NSLP Afterschool Snack Service – Documentation that nutritionally-balanced snacks are served, appropriate educational or enrichment activities are provided and counting and claiming is accurate.

Finding Detail: (1) The Afterschool Snack Service was not monitored within the first 4 weeks of operation, (2) the SFA is not following the Child and Adult Food Care Program (CACFP) snack meal pattern for the non-co-mingled preschool children, (3) snack production records were not completed consistently or accurately for the review period, and (4) snack crediting documentation was not maintained for the review period.

3. Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) – Validation that participating schools increase children's exposure to and consumption of a variety of fruits and vegetables and operate the program as prescribed.
