



## **Questions and Response Stems for Discussion or Writing**

## **General Comprehension Questions**

- What was the story/program about?
- Was this story/program fiction or nonfiction (make believe or real)?
- What happened in the beginning? Middle? End?
- Where did the story/program take place—what is the setting?
- Describe the characters in the story/program
- Do you know any real people similar to the characters in the story/program?
- Compare/contrast the characters in this story/program with those in another. In what ways are the characters, and their lifestyle, similar or different from you and your family?
- How are the characters' experiences similar to or different from yours? Do you share the same interests or beliefs? What can you learn from people who share different lifestyles, beliefs, and interests?
- Do you agree or disagree with the characters' actions/decisions? Why or why not?
- Were the characters treated fairly? with respect? How so, or why not? Use evidence from the story/program to support your response.
- Explain the main idea of the story/program.
- What facts did you learn from the story/program?
- What was the problem in the story/program? Was it solved? How? Use evidence from the story/program to support your response.
- What was the most interesting or exciting part of the story/program? Why?
- What changes would you make to this story/program?
- Create a new ending for the story/program.
- What was your opinion of this story/program?
- Summarize what you have learned in this story/program.
- What lessons/themes did you learn about from this story/program? Use evidence from the story/program to support your response.
