Equity

By *equity*, we mean equity of opportunity – opportunity for all students, regardless of socioeconomic background or disability. Our goal is that each individual student attains sufficient knowledge and skills to pursue the post-secondary education/training and career path of her/his choice and to become active and contributing members of our communities.

Outcomes: How will we know we we've achieved our goal of true equity?

- When all children with special needs and from difficult circumstances participate fully in pre-K educational programs.
- When all students achieve competency in language, mathematics, and sciences to the limits of their innate abilities, regardless of disability or background.
- When all students, regardless of their circumstances, graduate high school and go on to postsecondary training or education that maximizes their potential to succeed and contribute to their community.

We will measure and track these *outcomes* annually, compare our results to prior years' results and other states, and implement corrective action indicated by the results.

Inputs: What actions will we take to drive toward true equity?

- We will implement proactive measures to ensure that each family with pre-K-eligible children avail themselves of pre-K educational programs and services in their community.

- When all children with special needs and from difficult circumstances participate fully in pre-K educational programs.
- When all students achieve competency in language, mathematics, and sciences to the limits of their innate abilities, regardless of disability or background.
- When all students, regardless of their circumstances, graduate high school and go on to postsecondary training or education that maximizes their potential to succeed and contribute to their community.
