#### **Create your own Fireworks!**

For a fun afternoon project, create <u>fireworks in a jar</u> using oil, water and food coloring! Help your child jot down and record possible "predictions" of what might happen and "observations" of what actually occurred. What does your child think will happen when the oil is added to the water? When you add the food coloring? Swish the mixture around gently – what do they see? Were your predictions correct? Take pictures of your experiment and add them to your summer journal!

#### **Ice Excavations!**

It looks like we have hit summer in full force! Time for some ice excavation! Gather plastic water bottles, milk jugs (spout end cut off), baking pans and muffin tins, even beach buckets if you're feeling adventurous. Fill your containers with water and then have your child drop/sink in small toys such as dinosaurs, animals, fish or cars, beaded necklaces, buttons, pom poms, letters, foam shapes, fake gems and sparkles, and the list goes on! Just be aware of choking hazards please! Place full containers in your freezer. Once frozen, pop ice out of containers and the fun begins! Use squeeze and spray bottles filled with warm and cold water– which melts the ice faster? Use eye droppers or paint brushes dipped in water. Then add salt to see what happens! What other tools do you think would be helpful and safe to chip away the ice? So many ways to excavate the treasures out of the ice! Jot down your predictions and observations with this experiment too and don't forget your pictures for your journal!

### Sink or Float?

This sink or float experiment is another fun experiment that your child can put their "prediction" and "observation" skills to good use! Through their observations, they'll learn that objects float (buoyant) and some objects sink (dense). You can use many different objects for this experiment including: metal utensils, coins, stones, legos, keys, sticks, corks, marbles, toy cars, foam shapes, etc. Make a chart with predictions and see if they match up when you make your observations!
